

Stephen Freeman Primary School - Impact of PE Premium Spend 2025-26

To create the most impact for PE premium spending, much of the spend has focused on equipment, facilities, storage and teacher development and participation. There has been additional release time for the PE subject lead to provide time for lesson visits and coaching / feedback discussions with staff. As a result of this the teaching of PE has improved. This has been quantified in discussions with and surveys of, pupils, who report greater enjoyment and higher levels of challenge in PE this year. Participation in sports has remained a focus this year. This element of funding covered transport costs to a range of local tournaments, festivals and matches ensuring that all pupils could be fully involved in these. The equipment purchased this year has supported the teaching of a range of sports that we believe really benefit the children. Sports that are not taught in all schools to give the children a greater range of opportunities. A new shed and storage has been purchased to keep the equipment organised and available.
